



You are being transferred to another European country

Another European country is responsible for processing your asylum application. The IND (Immigration and Naturalisation Service) has told you which European country that is. The DTenV (Repatriation and Departure Service) will arrange your transfer to this country. That is why we are inviting you for an interview.

Do you have an appeal pending against the IND's decision? It is still important that you come to the interview so that you are given the right information.



What will the interview be about?

You have an assigned contact person at the Repatriation and Departure Service (DTenV): the departure supervisor. The departure supervisor will talk to you about what is needed to ensure a smooth journey and transfer. The departure supervisor stays in contact with you until your departure.

Do you want to return to your country of origin or to another country outside Europe where you can legally reside? If so, tell your departure supervisor immediately and they will find out whether it is still possible.

What happens if you fail to cooperate?

You are obliged to cooperate with your transfer. In the most extreme case, you may be held in immigration detention until you can leave the country. It is therefore important that you turn up for the interview with DTenV.
